The Student View is a powerful not-for-profit publication giving young people a chance to share their world through words.

THE NEED

Socio-educational disadvantage is one of the most intractable social malaises of our time. We at The Student View use journalism as an innovative method to tackle the following:

LOW LITERACY LEVELS

Young people in England have the lowest literacy levels in the developed world.

THE PROGRAMME

We offer journalism training for up to 20 students per school. Over 50% of TSV state school journalists must be in receipt of the pupil premium and at risk of not making the expected English progress.

On our programme pupils write three articles which are then published on our website.

EXPLORATION



Through differentiated exercises, activities and discovery sessions, professional journalists train students to research the issues that they are passionate about.

CREATION



Students write and redraft articles based on their topic of interest. They perfect three article types and develop their research skills. Students create responsible content to capture and challenge their peers.

SHARING



Students' articles are published on our website and can be shared via social media. At the end of the programme students present their work and experience of the programme to their year group at a showcase. This develops their leadership skills and promotes peer cohesion.

EMPOWERMENT



Students gain a stronger sense of self. The programme is proven to raise writing confidence, resilience and English attainment. Each school has at least one TSV Mentor (professional journalist) who leads your school's TSV newsroom.



IMPACT

Proven Impact

The Student View is the only organisation of its kind that gives young people from all backgrounds the chance to contribute to the public debate all year round.

Monitoring and evaluation consistently show a positive correlation between English progress and participation in The Student View programme.

THE STUDENT VIEW AT YOUR SCHOOL

The Student View is a 20 week programme which includes four visits from TSV team. These visits consist of:

01

Introduction (6 hours)

Over the first six sessions students are introduced to the fundamentals of ethical journalism. TSV impact measures pupils before the programme begins. This involves a news relationship questionnaire and the collection of your pupils' previous Summer Term 2 or Autumn Term 1 English grade. Students are then trained to write a listicle. This is a short form article that uses a list as its structure to entertain readers and increase its likelihood of going viral.



Feature Article (3 hours)

An in depth article based on a particular issue or person chosen by your students.



Opinion Article (3 hours)

An article which in detail explicitly expresses the thoughts of your students on a particular matter.



TSV Showcase

We prepare students to showcase their articles published on TSV site at an end of programme celebration assembly to their whole school or year group. All resources are provided by The Student View team.



Conclusion

Students will be post-programme impact measured through a news relationship questionnaire and the analysis of their Summer Term 2 English grade. A group of your pupils will meet high-profile journalists, politicians and campaigners during their time on the programme.



This consists of pupil selection, data collection and trip organisation. TSV staff are enhanced DBS checked meaning that the programme does not generate cover supervision.
